SECTION 4 - FIRST AID MEASURES

Contact With Eyes: Flush eyes immediately with plenty of water for 15 minutes and seek medical advice immediately.

Skin Contact: Liquid contact may remove natural skin oils resulting in skin irritation. Dermatitis may occur with prolonged contact.
